It may include people, animals & creatures, but they must be only incidental within the scene, not the main focal point.

Calculating Portrait Lens Sizes

	Full-frame (35mm)	APS-C (1.6 CF*)	Micro Four Thirds (2 CF*)
Standard	50mm	30mm	25mm
Portrait 01	80mm	55mm	40mm
Portrait 02	100mm	60mm	50mm
Zoom	24 - 105mm	16-55mm +	12-40mm +

For the sake of convenient comparison, lenses are often referred to by their '35mm equivalent (which is the tradition 35mm Film Format also known as 'Full Frame' in Professional Digital Cameras') focal length; for example a 18-55mm kit lens for APS-C may be described as a 28-90mm equivalent. This means simply that an 18-55mm lens on an APS-C format camera covers the same angle of view as a 28-90mm lens does on a *full-frame camera.* *Crop Factor - Lens size x CF = 35mm Equivalent.

Quad Comp




Old Data Projector




Old Treasury Building - 20 Spring St, East Melbourne VIC

The Old Treasury Building has a long history in Victoria and is widely regarded as one of the finest 19th century buildings in Melbourne, designed by nineteen-year-old architect JJ Clark and built between 1858 and 1862. 




