

An exhibition of 16 paintings will hang at the Cyril Callister Museum. Art teacher Simone Conroy said the project encouraged visitors to think outside the box while learning about art, architecture, design and local history. Beaufort inspires imagination. Explorer and surveyor Thomas Mitchell passed through the district on his expedition of 1836. With a population of about 1710, rapidly growing to a population of about 100,000 in the mid-1800s, when the town supported digs at Fiery Creek at the height of the gold rushes. It was a place of innovation and invention. Landmarks painted by the students include Beaufort Court House (1864) now home to the Beaufort Historical Society, the Mechanics Institute (1863) and Fire Brigade.
