Orionids Meteor Shower 2023

Phillip Island VIC

In 2023, the Orionids will peak on the night between 21–22 October.

But for those who are contemplating going to our Phillip Island Weekend Away on the weekend before, weather permitting would be a good opportunity to try capturing some amazing astro shots, and maybe even a great meteor shot to add to the dynamics of the shot.

Orionids are active every year in October, usually peaking around October 20/21. At its peak, up to 20 meteors are visible every hour. They are the second meteor shower of the month—the Draconids usually peak around October 7 or 8. The Orionid meteor shower is the second meteor shower created by Comet Halley. The Eta Aquarids in May is the other meteor shower created by debris left by Comet Halley. Halley takes around 76 years to make a complete revolution around the Sun. It will next be visible from Earth in 2061. Orionids are named after Orion, because the meteors seem to emerge or radiate from the same area in the sky as the constellation.



In the late 1990s, renowned architectural photographer lan McKenzie (1938-2014), picked up a collection of 240 glass plate negatives at a market. Believed to be from a Victorian news archive, they dated back to the 1930s. The slides lay dormant in a garage until 2020 when lan's wife Louise decided it was time to bring them into the light. What started as a simple goal of digitization morphed quickly into an exciting journey of discovery and kismet, taking in our photojournalistic history and the astonishing stories of interwar Melbourne, intense detective sessions with fellow historical networks, the merits of volunteer work and a very steep learning curve about photographic technology and processes. View a selection of printed images from the collection and learn more about this rare, fortunate find and its deep significance in documenting an extraordinary window in Melbourne's social history.






