Blue Lotus Water Gardens

On Saturday 17th February, the club has organised a bus trip to Blue Lotus Water Garden situated at Yarra Junction. Spanning over 14 acres (50,000 square meters) in size. The tropical-themed gardens contain more than 40 different ponds, lakes and water features which produce the biggest display of lotus and waterlily flowers in the southern hemisphere. The grounds also contain an amazing array of exotic plants, garden exhibits, fountains, waterfalls, floral sculptures, walks and scenic vistas. We have hired a 22 seater bus and Esther's partner, Allan, has kindly offered to drive. The trip is 3 hours one way, including a toilet stop. We will be leaving 8.30am on the dot from the club rooms at Lake Weeroona. Please be there no later than 8.15am. We will do a pick up at Heathcote at 9.10am so please be near the toilet block at Barrack Street, Heathcote by 9am. We hope to get back to base between 5.30 and 6pm. We are doing a group booking, so please let me know asap (first in gets a seat) if you are going. The bus fee per person is \$10. The committee looked at the list created by members at the brainstorming session and selected the following Set Subjects for the BCC Photographic Competitions coming up in 2024. Esther has kindly created brief definitions for each subject to give an idea of the type of images we're looking for.

Due Tuesday 13th February 2024 FROM BEHIND

Capture the subject from a unique perspective - focusing on the subject's rear view.

WINE / VITICULTURE **Due Tuesday 11th April 2024**

Capture the essence and artistry of wine in its various stages; from vines to vineyards to wine cellars to the glass.

DOORS & WINDOWS Due Tuesday 11th June 2024

Explore and capture the beauty, character, and stories found in doors and windows. They can convey a sense of place, history and human connection.

STEAM / VINTAGE **Due Tuesday 13th August 2024**

Explore and capture the nostalgia, beauty and character of steampowered machinery, vintage vehicles and other relics from the past.

MACRO / CLOSE-UP **Due Tuesday 10th September 2024**

Capture the subject at a very close range, revealing intricate details and textures that are not easily visible to the naked eye.

PHOTOGRAPHY ONLINE

Photography Online is a 60 minute monthly photo magazine show hosted on YouTube. You may already be aware of our channel, but we have taken a break from releasing output during 2023 to allow us time to record more exciting content from all over the world.

Magnificent Macedon Ranges Exhibition




