The book 130 years of BCC is currently in its infant stages.


Research on is well underway way on the very early years with a surprising amount of information readily available.

Canon EOS R5 camera and lens for sale

My health no longer permits me to use this camera, so with much reluctance it is up for sale.

I purchased this camera new in late 2021 At the same time I purchased a second-hand Canon white lens 70 to 200mm lens.

Prior to this purchase I owned a Canon EOS 5D and the following lens all purchased new:



Canon Macro EF lens 100mm (red ring) Canon Zoom EF lens 24-105mm (red ring) Canon Zoom EF lens 17-40mm (red ring) Canon EF lens 50mm F1.8

The Canon R5 comes with a Canon 2 times converter which fits all of the above lens. This converter does not effect any F settings.

The Canon R5 manual is 925 pages, so I purchased a Video by John Greengo that is very user friendly. This video will be included.

I also have a large TENBA backpack which carries all of the above equipment with ease. The R5 has two cards — a 128GB micro card plus a 512GB Angelbird AV Pro card for use when taking video. I have a card reader for this card.

The camera takes 8K photos measuring 8191 x 5463 which are about 50MB in size. All camera adjustments are controlled by the touch screen.

All equipment is in top class condition and has always been stored in the backpack.

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In my own words

Introducing Pauline Moore, BCC President

My introduction to photography was when my Great-great Aunt and Uncle brought me a camera at age 10 or thereabouts. All I remember of the camera was it used 110mm cartridges, which we took to the local shop to be processed.

At the age of 12 Santa brought me a Chinon SLR camera. Fred, yes I named my camera, and everywhere I went that camera always sat on the seat with me, never allowed to travel in the car boot.

At about this age I decided I wanted to be a professional photographer. Unfortunately, courses were super expensive back then and I never made it. Although, thinking about it now, I have realised I have actually achieved something very close to it.

At the age of 13 I combined my love of Motorsport and photography, even though my Dad was trying to get me to race. Taking photos of Go-karts from the infield was what I wanted to do. Back then I would sell a standard size print for \$2. I made a lot of money doing this, enough to buy telephoto lenses and darkroom equipment. My photos



ended up in the newspaper and overseas, I was even given an all expenses paid trip to Adelaide to take photos.

As the years went on I remember doing a promotional shoot one afternoon during school hours. Unfortunately, it was during my year 11 tech drawing end of year exams. My teacher was NOT happy. I was however able to put in extra time at home and passed the exam.

After getting married and moving interstate I was asked to do portrait, and wedding Photography. This continued when we moved back to Victoria with family in tow.

In the mid 2000's I began taking photos of my children racing Speedway. They convinced me to buy a digital camera because they said my original camera, which still worked beautifully, was too 'old-fashioned " and digital is so much easier. So, I caved under the pressure and brought a Pentax K20d because all my lenses

would move over from the other camera. Worst idea I ever had. I used that camera for about 10 years mostly on manual because I could not work it out. I became so frustrated with my photography I was about to sell the lot until I saw an advertisement for a camera group starting up in Heathcote. Well let's just say I was so embarrassed when I was shown how to use my camera. I'm still not sure to this day why I couldn't work it out. My theory is it was because I read the damn manual

From then on I made friends with people who took nature photos and so my love of photography came back with vengeance, and I began taking photos of anything that stands still.

From there I started doing workshops and have now discovered that although I may not always be very successful I love the challenge of photographing something different.
